## REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTERED MEMBERS AND/OR REGISTERED ARCHITECTURAL PRACTICES TO RESIGN REGISTRATION IN THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA

Registered members and/or registered architectural practices, requesting their names be removed from the Provincial registry, shall meet the following requirements to resign in good standing:

- 1. Forward written notification to the Association office which confirms the following:
  - (a) That the registered member and/or registered architectural practice has fulfilled its professional obligations including any warranty related inspections, ongoing renovations or additions and related project certification for applicable authorities;
  - (b) That the registered member and/or registered architectural practice has informed their client(s) that they have surrendered their registration, seal and right to practice in the Province of Manitoba;

## And, if applicable:

- (c) That in cases where above-noted obligations have been surrendered to another firm/practice, such information has and is provided to the client(s), relevant authorities and the Association office;
- (d) That the electronic architectural seal and/or electronic corporate stamp issued by the MAA will no longer be used, and has now been deleted from all electronic devices.
- \*NOTE: The correspondence must be submitted with an original signature of the registered member concerned; or in the case of a practice, it must be placed on firm letterhead and be under the original signature of the sole proprietor or at least one registered member that is a partner or director, as the case may be.
- 2. Return membership certificate (and, if applicable, corporate Certificate of Approval) to the Association office
- 3. Return physical architectural seal (and physical corporation stamp) to the Association office, if one or both had been issued.
- 4. Remit full payment of any outstanding dues, fees, levies and/or assessments to the Association office.

The Manitoba Association of Architects will inform the appropriate authorities having jurisdiction that the registered member and/or registered architectural practice is no longer licensed in the province and as such, is no longer in a position to accept or fulfill any further professional obligations or requirements in accordance with the Manitoba Building Code or The Architects Act.
